

WHEN IS CLIENT'S MENTAL HEALTH RELEVANT?

--COMPETENCE

AT TIME OF ALLEGATIONS
--NGRI
--DIMINISHED CAPACITY

AT TIME OF ARREST
--VOLUNTARINESS OF MIRANDA RIGHTS

-THEN, NOW AND IN THE FUTURE
--MITIGATION

NOW: COMPETENCE - 552.020 RSMo



No person who as a result of mental disease or defect lacks capacity to understand the proceedings against him or to assist in his own defense shall be tried, convicted or sentenced for the commission of an offense so long as the incapacity endures.

THEN: RESPONSIBILITY-NGRI

552.030
Mental Disease or Defect
Excluding Responsibility

A person is not responsible for criminal conduct if, at the time of such conduct, as a result of mental disease or defect such person was incapable of knowing and appreciating the nature, quality, or wrongfulness of such person's conduct.




Teen found not guilty by reason of insanity

THEN: DIMINISHED CAPACITY

Mental Disease or Defect
Excluding a Culpable Mental State

To prove that the defendant did or did not have a state of mind which is an element of the offense



THEN, NOW AND IN THE FUTURE - MITIGATION




At the sentencing hearing, defense counsel presents mitigating factors to humanize the defendant and/or offer explanations for the defendant's behavior in an effort to obtain leniency.



552.010. Mental disease or defect defined

congenital and traumatic mental conditions as well as disease



552.010 Mental disease or defect <u>does not include</u>:

-an abnormality manifested only by repeated criminal or otherwise antisocial conduct,

-alcoholism without psychosis or drug abuse without psychosis

-an abnormality manifested only by criminal sexual psychopathy

RULES TO FOLLOW



1. CAN'T EVALUATE FOR RESPONSIBILITY UNTIL KNOW CLIENT IS COMPETENT

2. YOU SHOULD ALWAYS BE FIRST TO REQUEST RESPONSIBILITY EVAL

3. DON'T LET JUDGE ORDER OR STATE REQUEST 552.030 EVALUATION

MORE RULES



1. CAN'T WAIVE COMPETENCE EVALUATION

2. CAN'T LET CLIENT PLEA OR GO TO TRIAL IF CLIENT NOT COMPETENT

3. ONLY CLIENT CAN DECIDE TO PURSUE NGRI

BUT FIRST, COLLECT RECORDS
